

SITUATION OVERVIEW

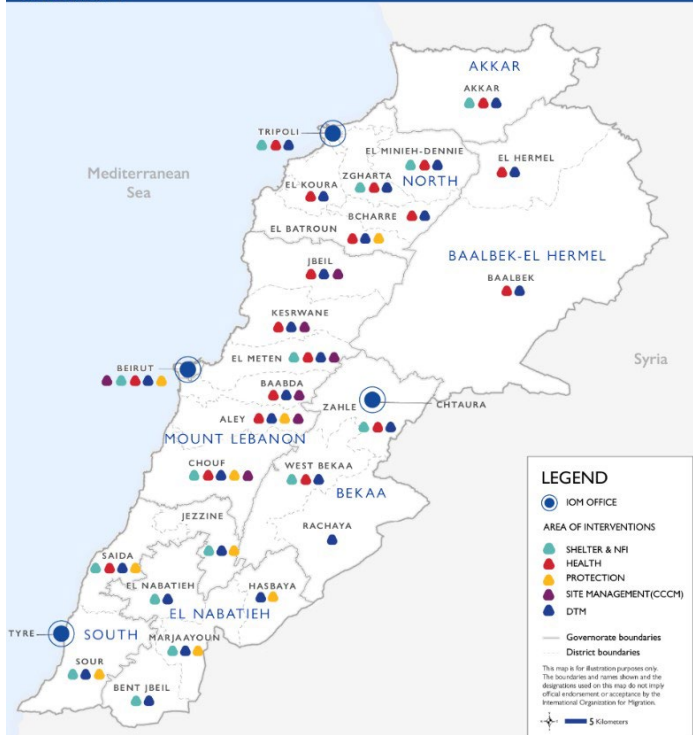
As of 29 January, the announcement of a cessation of hostilities between 27 November 2024 and 26 January 2025, which was extended until 18 February, has prompted more than 883,203 internally displaced persons (IDPs) to begin returning to their communities. Despite the ceasefire, more than 100,000 IDPs remain in Lebanon, compared to the nearly 900,000 recorded between September and November 2024. Of the 103,346 individuals remaining in displacement 3,055 are registered in 38 collective sites, mostly schools or other public or private spaces, while decommissioning assessments and works have begun to return prior collective sites to their original purpose. IOM is closely monitoring mobility trends, assessing the evolving context, and continuing to address the immediate

humanitarian needs of those affected by the conflict, including returning IDPs.

In support of the government-led emergency response, the humanitarian community has extended the Interagency Flash Appeal for an additional three months (from January to March 2025) seeking USD 371 million and aiming to assist 1 million people through the delivery of urgent life-saving assistance and protection, especially through the winter months. As part of this extended Flash Appeal, IOM is appealing for funds to support urgent lifesaving assistance in the areas of shelter, basic needs, health, protection, site management and coordination, and its Displacement Tracking Matrix which informs the humanitarian response.

RESPONSE HIGHLIGHTS

During the reporting period, IOM assisted 55,568 individuals with multi-sectoral support. IOM assessed 63 collective sites and apartments' clusters and continued to provide targeted protection services to displaced people, including an estimated 1,070 migrants living in the targeted collective sites and apartments. IOM made 28 referrals to partners for needs under Shelter (39%), Protection (21%), Health (18%), Basic Assistance (7%), WASH (7%), and other sectors. IOM provided 2,301

people with protection services, 2,880 people with health services, 746 people with heaters and gas cylinders, and 49,479 displaced people (IDPs) with core relief items, such as blankets, mattresses, and pillows. Additionally, IOM delivered 6,312 liters of fuel to the Ministry of Public Health. IOM is also continuing evacuation assistance in coordination with embassies, assisting 162 migrants with their return.

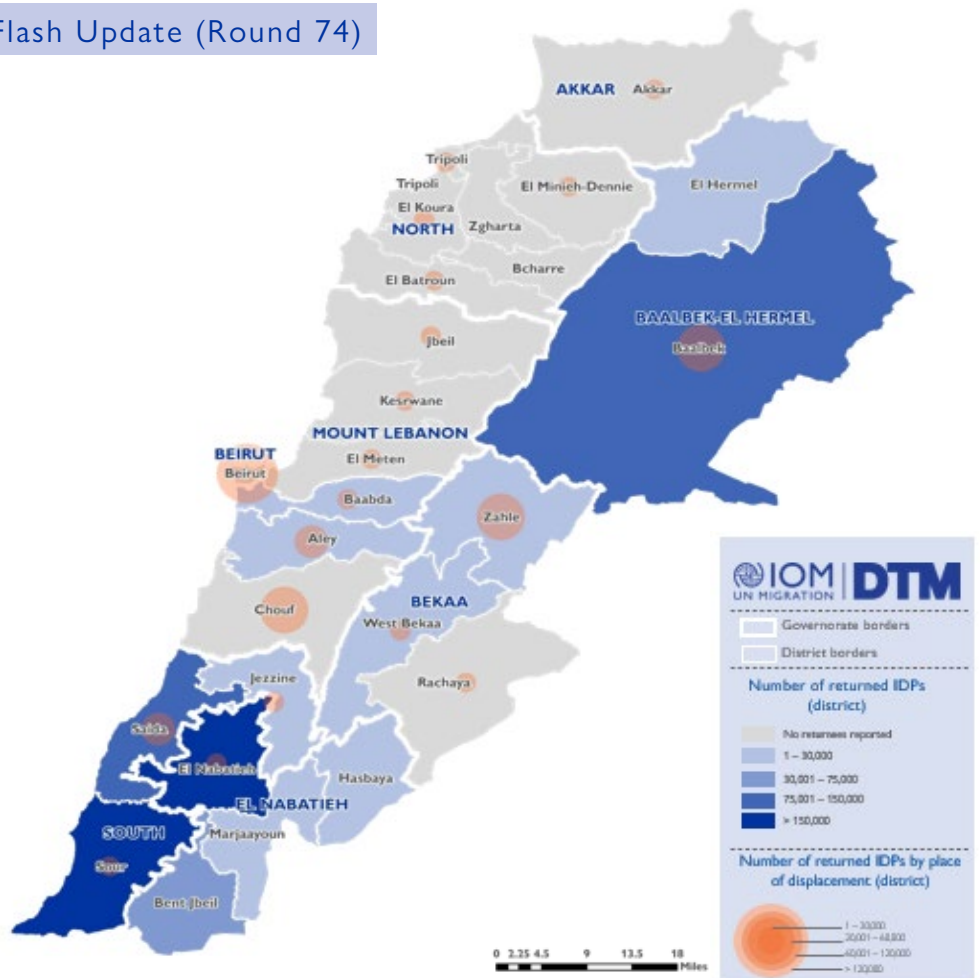
