

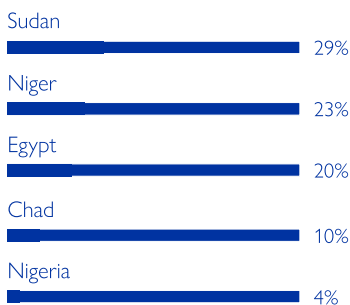
## KEY FINDINGS

Libya's Migrant Report Round 55  
(November - December 2024)

 **824,131**

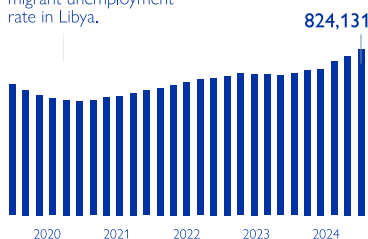
migrants were identified by DTM Libya during round 55 of data collection (November - December 2024). Around eight in ten (79%) were adult males, 11 per cent were adult females, and 10 per cent were children, among whom 3 per cent were unaccompanied minors.

## HIGHLIGHTS

### Storm Daniel

**Health:** Essential medical services to 580 displaced individuals in Shahaat, Soussa, Thulmetha, Tukra and Derna.

**MHPSS:** Group support and psychosocial support awareness sessions were provided for 32 individuals in Albayda and Derna.

### Support to host communities and IDPs

**Health:** Essential medical services to 1,248 host communities and IDPs through IOM's support to primary health clinics and hospitals.

### Sudan response

**Health:** IOM medical mobile teams provided primary health care services to 576 Sudanese in Ejdabiya and Alkufra.

**MHPSS:** Psychological first aid, psychosocial needs assessments, basic counselling sessions, psychosocial support awareness sessions, psychoeducation sessions and focus group discussions for 97 Sudanese in Ejdabiya, Alkufra, Benghazi, Beni Walid, Ghat, Misratah, Sebha, Tripoli and Zwara.

**Protection:** IOM provided protection services for 30 Sudanese in Tripoli.

**NFIs and food support:** 606 Sudanese received food kits and non-food items.


## IOM Weekly Programming (13 - 19 February 2025)


IOM facilitated a two-day workshop on the role of consular services in legal identity and identity management for 13 diplomats from the following consulates: Bangladesh, Chad, Ghana, Guinea, Mali, Niger, and Nigeria. The workshop provided targeted training and tools to strengthen the role of consular officers in legal identity and identity management.


IOM organized a workshop on Data Triangulation, Analysis, and Reporting for representatives from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Higher Education, the House of Representatives, and scholars from various universities across Libya. This workshop is part of an ongoing series of capacity-building activities focused on research methods and data collection, aimed at strengthening the development of migration studies and policies.

## ASSISTANCE PROVIDED IN THE REPORTING WEEK

During the reporting period, IOM continued to support vulnerable migrants and IDPs through the provision of protection services, health care, psychosocial support, technical cooperation and direct assistance.

 **653 MIGRANTS** were assisted with Voluntarily Humanitarian Return to The Gambia, Ghana, Nigeria and Pakistan.

 **1,106 MIGRANTS** received **DIRECT ASSISTANCE** (NFIs, HKs, clothing and emergency food based on needs).

 **108 PROTECTION ASSESSMENTS** as well as 10 child protection assessments and 24 victim of trafficking assessments.

 **3,332 MIGRANTS & IDPs** provided with medical screenings, check-ups and primary urgent health care consultations.

 **31 MIGRANTS** provided with **MHPSS** services, including through the MHPSS **HELPLINE**

 **121 MIGRANTS** were informed on the dangers of irregular migration.
