## IOM Turkey Funding Requirements – 20 million USD

FUNDING AREA	OBJECTIVE	AMOUNT NEEDED
Tracking Mobility Impacts of COVID-19	IOM will contribute to providing data and analysis on population mobility to understand the effects of COVID-19 in Turkey, across borders, and at regional levels. Data remains crucial for a more targeted and evidence-based response.	<b>90,000 USD</b>
Points of Entry	IOM will provide support to the border authorities and partners to enhance public health measures at prioritized points of entry to Turkey.	<b>400,000 USD</b>
Logistics, Supply Chain, and Recruitment	IOM will assist national authorities and UN partners in the procurement, storage and distribution of critical supplies. Support will be provided to IOM operational capacities from ongoing programmes such as shelter and Non-Food Items.	<b>1,000,000 USD</b>
Protection	The current COVID-19 emergency is exacerbating pre-existing vulnerabilities of migrants, refugees and displaced persons who maybe at greater risk of violence and discrimination. IOM is committed to ensuring their protection through integrated COVID response protection measures.	<b>440,000 USD</b>
Addressing socio-economic impacts	IOM is working across sectors to help affected communities address their basic needs through cash and in-kind support and provide means for durable recovery in the post-crisis environment.	<b>18,070,000 USD</b>

# IOM Turkey Interventions -- COVID-19 Response

Since the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic in Turkey in March 2020, IOM has been responding to the emerging needs of migrants, refugees and host communities. As of mid-April 2020, IOM has distributed over **310,312** basic needs items including hygiene kits, gloves and disinfectant equipment to Turkish border authorities and municipalities across **10** provinces. Counselling, psychosocial support and referral services have been provided by phone and online for over **2,269** beneficiaries. More targeted awareness raising about COVID-19 has been done by providing crucial information by phone and online to **7,698** beneficiaries. Additionally, to address the socio-economic impacts of COVID-19, IOM has provided cash assistance to **100** affected families, **700** food baskets and **20** sewing and locking machines to two municipalities. These new working modalities ensure that service provision and protection of migrants and refugees continue, while respecting social distancing and lock down measures.
