

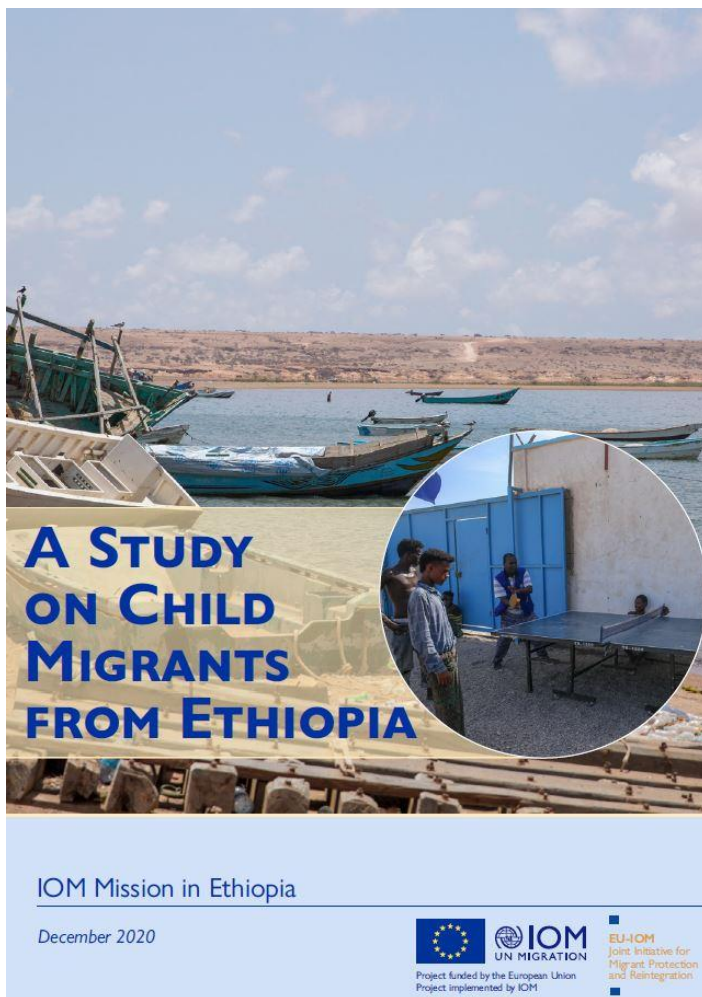

PROGRAMMATIC HIGHLIGHTS

RETURNS & REINTEGRATION

- **2,463** returnee migrants from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) were registered, profiled and screened for vulnerabilities upon arrival.
- **2,336** returnee migrants from KSA assisted with onward transportation allowance (OTA) and NFIs.
- **13** returnee migrants from KSA referred for psychiatric support and received tailored Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS).
- **138** returnee migrants received economic and social support.
- **Three** returnee migrants received reintegration counselling and vulnerability assessment

- **Three** returnee migrants received one-on-one and in-group psychosocial counselling.
- **One** returnee migrant received kaizen, entrepreneurship, vocational and psychosocial support training.
- **76** returnee migrants received COVID-19 related cash grant.

BEHAVIOUR CHANGE COMMUNICATIONS (BCC)

- **287** potential migrants received services through hotline.
- **2,000** Information Education Communication (IEC) materials distributed.
- **37** Community Conversation Focal (CCFs) trainers received refresher training.

MIGRATION GOVERNANCE

- Distribution plan and Deed of Donation (DoD) preparation for 11 Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) colleges had started in coordination with the [Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs](#) (MOLSA), federal TVETs and the Deans of the selected TVET colleges.
- Conducted training for 24 service providers on migrant protection and victims assistance (MPVA).
- Media professionals trained by IOM on responsible journalism in migration related topics drafted five case stories and shared with IOM for review.

PROTECTION

- **87** migrants (30F / 57M) benefitted from direct assistance and protection services i.e. food, water, accommodation, hygiene kits and onward transportation allowances. Among the 87 migrants, 17 were UMC.
- **46** migrants who were supported through Emergency Migration Response Centres (EMRCs) are identified for job creation support.

HEALTH

- 10,080 Medical consultations conducted.
- 17,683 Individuals benefitted from health awareness sessions.
- 2,593 Children less than five years old screened for malnutrition.
- 3,063 Women of reproductive age benefitted from sexual and reproductive health services.
- 486 Health assessments conducted.

EMERGENCY AND POST-CRISIS (EPC)

Shelter/NFIs

- 48,201** Individuals benefitted from cash-based assistance for Emergency Shelter - Non Food Items (ES/NFI).
- 23,077** Individuals benefitted from ES/NFIs assistance.
- 2,055** Individuals benefitted from full or partial shelter repair kits.
- 3,132** Individuals benefitted from housing, land and property support.

WASH

- 156,170** Individuals benefitted from hygiene promotion activities.
- 4,075** Individuals benefitted from rehabilitation of sanitation facilities.
- 1,000** Individuals benefitted from rehabilitation of water infrastructure.

Cash

- 37,006** Individuals benefitted from cash support.

SMS

- 341,432** Individuals registered in Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) sites and reached through Site Management Support (SMS).
- 76** IDP collective sites reached by SMS.

Protection

- 4,877** Individuals received MHPSS services.
- 6,278** Individuals participated in protection awareness sessions.

Transition and Recovery

- 200** Households (HHs) recieved agriculture tools, inputs, vegetable seeds, poultry chicken.
- 160** IDPs/host communities/returnee migrants engaged in livelihood/income generating activity.

DISPLACEMENT TRACKING MATRIX (DTM)

- **220,762** IDPs identified through Emergency Tracking Tool.
- **17,316** migrants identified at flow monitoring points.

OPERATIONS

- **18** refugees departed Ethiopia for resettlement purposes.
- Documents of **45** refugees and migrants verified for different Embassies.
